Here is one way to help that was used when BLC provided monetary support to the survivors of the hurricanes a few months ago. You do NOT need to be a member of Thrivent but you will need to use a credit card. Your donation will be “amplified” by Thrivent with the organization donating \$1 for every \$2 you donate! Their goal is \$1,000,000 in personal donations and they will donate \$500,000. Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) is one of the organizations coordinating with partners to assess the needs of people impacted by the wildfires and provide assistance. They will provide for immediate needs and recovery amid the widespread destruction. LDR has set its goal at \$250,000 and has already raised \$138,066. It is committed to accompanying recovering communities for months and years to come.
