Dear brothers and sisters of Bethlehem,

This past week, I returned from the 2024 National Youth Gathering in New Orleans, along with Tina and Makena Dohm, and Owen Munger from BLC, along with 16 other youth and leaders from our partner church, Mamrelund Lutheran in Kent City, Michigan. It was a wonderful week of worship, service, faith formation and – yes – travel by van (road trip!) Yet it was on that journey that we had wonderful conversation, before, during and after the Gathering in "NOLA." The event's theme "Created to Be…" Here are some reflections, based on our subthemes:

Tues, 7/16 - We are Created to Be <u>BRAVE</u>, to show up with an open mind and heart, willing to be challenged (Psalm 27). On both the ride down, and the opening worship, we embraced the bravery to step outside our comfort zones, leave the familiar behind and live into Psalm 139:14. Our first speaker, Dr. Michael J. Chan, told us "You were precious long before you could prove it," and that "this world is rarely prepared for love's variety and brightness."

Wed, 7/17 - We are Created to Be <u>AUTHENTIC</u>, to bring our whole selves and know that we are loved by our Creator (Matthew 5:14-16). Each night we gathered – after evening worship and free time, to share in our Mamrelund-Bethlehem group of 20 our "highs and lows" and reflections for the day. This also happened to be the day that our group had our service project ("accompaniment day"), where we cleaned up a local park in the city. We also learned from speaker Dr. Jacqueline Bussie how to live as "anyways people," with our scars and hope and joy.

Thu, 7/18 – We are Created to Be <u>FREE</u>, to be transformed by the gospel (Romans 12:2). This day we worshipped in the afternoon with 1,300 of our ELCA neighbors in Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana (i.e. Region 6). We spent a couple hours getting to know the French Quarter and Mississippi Riverfront before heading to worship with all 16,000 of our ELCA Gathering friends. Speaker and Pastor Emily Harkins shared her ministry and mission with The Dwelling church for the down-and-out and otherwise overlooked people of Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

Fri, 7/19 – **We are Created to Be** <u>**DISRUPTIVE**</u>, to work for justice for all our siblings (Matthew 21:12). This day we were blessed to eat at a famous local restaurant with authentic "N'Awlins" cuisine – Dooky Chase's. Later that afternoon, we also had an amazing shuttle tour of the city and outlying levies and outskirts of New Orleans. At worship that night we again heard amazing music and prophetic messages from Austin Channing Brown and others who talked about the joys and challenges of diversity, while being called to work for positive change.

Sat, 7/20 – We are Created to Be <u>DISCIPLES</u>, to be sent out into the world to love our neighbor just as we are loved by God (Matthew 22:36-40). For our final day, we packed up, went to a wonderful last worship, and headed back to Michigan by way of Memphis... Indeed sent.

No doubt you will hear more about the National Youth Gathering, and how it inspired our team. As we enter into Vacation Bible School and then August, we are truly Created to Be: Bethlehem together! Shalom!

FINANCIAL NEWS

June income was \$38,731, compared to projected income of \$28,491. We received \$10,240 more than projected. Expenses were \$35,143, compared to a budget of \$30,543. This resulted in spending \$4,600 more than budgeted. For the month, the church brought in \$3,587 more than we spent.

Year-to-date income is \$191,744, compared to projected income of \$173,421. This resulted in the church receiving \$18,323 more than projected. Expenses were \$203,376, compared to a budget of \$191,515. We have spent \$11,860 more than budgeted. For the year, the church has spent \$11,631 more than we brought in.

<u>Coffee and Cookies on Sunday</u> Remember that treats and a drink on Sunday are appreciated by all. Please take a moment to sign up to bring cookies or some other tasty treat on the Sunday that works best for you. Or sign up to prepare the coffee to give our loyal volunteer Mary Ann Tanis a day off.
