FINANCIAL NEWS

September income was \$29,831, compared to projected income of \$28,491. We received \$1,340 more than projected. Expenses were \$27,430, compared to a budget of \$39,493. This resulted in spending \$12,062 less than budgeted. For the month, the church brought in \$2,401 more than we spent.

Year-to-date income is \$283,565, compared to projected income of \$258,594. This resulted in the church receiving \$24,971 more than projected. Expenses were \$296,396, compared to a budget of \$293,273. We have spent \$3,123 more than budgeted. For the year, the church has spent \$12,830 more than we brought in.
