The Vision team and BLC members who helped write this new mission statement were emphatic that worshiping and welcoming were central to who we are.. But right in the *middle* of those things is a word that caught us all by surprise: work. It's not a word that comes naturally to Lutherans ("We are saved by grace through faith, apart from works [with an "s"!]") But when we abide in God's love and gift of salvation and grace... something amazing happens. We desire not only to "be" (think Psalm 46: "Be still and know that I am God"); we want also to "become" disciples that serve actively, responsively, and boldly... not unlike God's call for justice, mercy and humility in Micah's chapter 6.

So, as we finalize our vision statement soon – the text that "visualizes" our mission – be on the lookout for key words like "embody" (both <u>being</u> and <u>becoming</u> that mission), phrases like "boldy following Jesus," and carry-over words from our previous mission and vision like "serving the world and one another" and "caring for God's Creation"... all in the name of Welcome. We have exciting gospel to embody at Bethlehem this year and moving forward. And we are just getting started!

DECEMBER 2024 FINANCIAL NEWS

December income was \$46,925 compared to budgeted income of \$30,555. We received \$16,370 more than budgeted. This higher income was primarily from a one-time special donation of \$10,000 directly related to basement repair along with \$3,400 higher offerings and \$2,400 of Other Income from sources like Thrivent Choice and Oleson's Receipts. Expenses were \$34,350 compared to a budget of \$31,350. This resulted in spending \$3,000 more than budgeted. Higher miscellaneous repair expenses made up \$2,075 of this overage. For the month, the church brought in \$12,575 more than was spent. For the year income was \$396,231 compared to budgeted income of \$348,156. This resulted in the church receiving \$48,075 more than budgeted. Expenses were \$414,881, compared to a budget of \$386,014. For the year the church has spent \$28,867 more than budgeted. Expenses exceeded income by \$18,650. If you remove the one-time \$10,000 basement special donation from operating income, our operating deficit comes to \$28,650 for 2024.

Our basement needs help

Little by little our basement has succumbed to the rise and fall of the water table causing our lower hallway to seep water from the floor. At the January 5 Congregational meeting, we approved fundraising to remediate the problem. We will:

- Remove asbestos tiles in the hallway and classrooms
- Digging a trench to collect the water
- Add two sump pumps to collect and dispose of the water
- Painting the entire lower level
- Install flooring

How can you help?

This project will cost \$70,000. Yes, it is a lot of money, but it will resolve the water problem once and for all. THEN, our entire building will be available for use by ourselves and the community.


paying your own way)! It'll be a fun day out in the winter wonderland - let me know if you plan to join us so that we can keep an eye out for you!






Bliss Tungnung, a graduate of the International Women Leaders program, opened Bliss International School in 2023

Bliss Tungnung, a former International Women Leaders scholar and a 2022 graduate of Concordia College in Moorhead, Minn., is using her psychology degree to make a difference in her home community in Manipur, India. Not long after she graduated, civil war broke out among local ethnic groups. Upon arriving home, she saw a need for psychosocial care and education among the children of her community. With **support from Lutheran Disaster Response** and her denomination, the Manipur Evangelical Lutheran Church, she became a community organizer and counselor for people, especially children, traumatized by the ethnic violence.

As a counselor, Bliss identified education gaps for both local children and children displaced by the violence. In 2023, she established Bliss International School to address these gaps. "The main problem I see with education in my city is the lack of psychological awareness," she said. "I believe that education should foster the child both academically and mentally to utilize their knowledge to the fullest." At the school, students not only learn basic skills such as reading and writing but are encouraged to use those skills to express their emotional needs and to create space for themselves to become global citizens.
