## “Be still and know that I am...”



The above verse (or part of it) is from Psalm 46:10. At first glance, you might think something is missing. But let's start with what we know.

God says to us to **be still**...Perhaps this is an invitation, or maybe a command – but let's go with the invite! Being still takes effort, especially these days. Then God asks us to reach back into our minds and hearts, and **know** - to acknowledge something. What is that knowing? Quite literally, we might say that it is just knowing **that God is God**. Yet I think it includes a lot more...

*In late spring, I spent some time being still and reflecting on last summer – the sabbatical that was a summer like no other, and now the summer that was to come. Something told me this summer would also prove quite unique. Late May began with a flurry of Vision Team preparations for the fall and shortly after with a family vacation, perforated by an online preaching class that ended in June. Then came the final prep for the ELCA National Youth Gathering in mid-July and another few days with family in Kentucky, followed by the week-long Youth Gathering itself in New Orleans. Upon our return, Bethlehem quickly ramped up for the first Vacation Bible School since sabbatical and (more importantly) since our Ministry Coordinator, Alanna Steffunick, joined us a year and a half ago. What an amazing job Alanna did leading us all through a “Scuba!” adventure with Jesus and 20 wonderful kiddos + volunteers! And since all of that deep diving, we will have come up briefly for air before a fall of new school and church rhythms and a Visioning process the likes of which we haven't done fully since 2012. I am told we may sneak in a Stewardship campaign that could begin as early as mid-September and pause for visioning, then culminating in November. Time will tell, and all will be well.*

*So are we ready to begin? To become something new together at Bethlehem? Might we first “be still” for a moment. After all, the words “begin” and “become” simply must start out with “**be.**” We place our being and trust, in the providence and patience of the One who always ends this verse... **God.***

## **FINANCIAL NEWS**

July income was \$34,566, compared to projected income of \$28,641. We received \$5,925 more than projected. Expenses were \$28,978, compared to a budget of \$30,926. This resulted in spending \$1,948 less than budgeted. For the month, the church brought in \$5,588 more than we spent.

Year-to-date income is \$226,299, compared to projected income of \$202,062. This resulted in the church receiving \$24,237 more than projected. Expenses were \$232,268, compared to a budget of \$222,442. We have spent \$9826 more than budgeted. For the year, the church has spent \$5,969 more than we brought in.

"A few years ago, in September 2019, a house behind a community center in the El Bosque subdivision of Santiago, Chile, was consumed by a deadly fire. The frame of the gutted house still stands, a stark reminder of the neglect suffered by this low-income area.

"But today new life is springing up among the ruins. On a strip of patio extending alongside the premises, peas, carrots, celery, lettuce, parsley, eggplants, Swiss chard and other vegetables sprout from five elevated planters, attached to metal structures that were built from tables salvaged after the fire. This is the work of the Amajudisa Community Gardening Group, led by Educación Popular en Salud (EPES) health monitors - and supported by gifts to ELCA World Hunger."

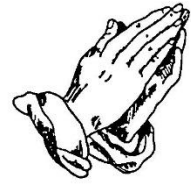
